After about eight years with Teledyne Geotech in Texas, working on detection of underground explosions, he came west. He is working at the Institute of Geophysics at Scripps, and is involved in computer work with both the Department of Oceanography and Department of Solid Earth Geophysics. While working in the latter, he became interested in the seismicity of San Diego.

TOPIC:

Seismicity of San Diego, 1934 - 1974

Mr. Simons will discuss his development of a model of seismic velocities for the San Diego area from quarry blasts and the subsequent use of this data to relocate all of the earthquakes in this area. These locations can then be evaluated and

compared with the known local fault picture.


