SAN DIEGO GEOLOGY REVISITED by E. Dean Milow

**Topic:** Mr. Milow will focus on several stratigraphic aspects of the local geology which he feels are not fully understood resulting in published mapping which is inconsistent with the existing conditions. The major emphasis of this presentation will relate to discussion of the local type-sections locations, their correlation, and inconsistencies which present themselves when the type sections are compared with much of the published information available. Included will be some discussion of available subsurface information which seemingly necessitates modification and/or revision of the existing geologic base being used in the San Diego area. It is possible that some discussion of the famous/infamous/active/inactive/potentially active, etc. Rose Canyon Fault will be in order.

E. Dean Milow has had a long involvement with San Diego geology. He was one of the three instructors at SDSU when the Geology Department began issuing diplomas. After 10 years at SDSU, he went to Scripps Institute where he was a member of the Deep Sea Drilling Project. He has consulted in engineering geology and petroleum for the private and public sector and is currently working with Biostratigraphics, a division of McClelland Engineers, as a biostratigraphic consultant.
