NEWS & NOTES

1) The focus of this month's program will be San Diego's gem-bearing pegmetites, mining history, basic geology, localities, mining methods and economics. Three of the mining districts: the Pala, Mesa Grande, and Romona, will be highlighted. The talk will be followed with examples of fine mineral specimens and faceted gemstones.

Cynthia Marcusson Rodrick recieved her B.S. in 1985 and completed her senior thesis on the Himalaya Mine, which produces tourmaline in San Diego County. After graduation, she completed a plan and topographic map of the Stewart Mine, also a tourmaline producer in San Diego. She is employed by Pala International where her work centers around the presentation and promotion of colored gemstones. She has authored several articles on tourmaline and gem mining, including an article published in the Mineralogical Record. In addition, she edits The Gem Spectrum, Pala's newsletter to jewelers nationwide. Ms. Rodrick is frequently contacted by trade magazines to help with the reporting of trends in gemstone pricing and availablity.
