(The landslide that became a dam)

The Thistle landslide, which moved in April has blocked the Spanish Fork River. The town of Thistle was inundated as was the main line of the Denver Rio Grande Railroad. Tom Freeman is a member of the Woodward Clyde Consulting Underground Construction group who designed and monitored the construction of a Lake Tap that drained the 60,000 acre feet of water behind the Thistle landslide.
