

# Meet Our | Speaker & Topic



## ALI FATTAH, PE

### ABSTRACT:

Ali Fattah graduated from California State University, Sacramento with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering and is a California registered professional engineer in Civil Engineering. He also earned a Master's in Business Administration awarded by the University of San Diego and is certified by International Code Council as a Building Plans Examiner.

Ali started his career with the City of San Diego in 1984 with the Building Inspection Department, predecessor to todays DSD and has performed reviews for a variety of major projects. He also has taken a lead role on the review and inspections for temporary structures that are associated with Special Events. Ali was promoted in 2000 to Structural Engineer Senior and worked as the Research Engineer performing various Code Development and Code adoption roles on the behalf of the Department at the local, State and national level. This activity included appointments by the State and International Code Council to serve on various code writing committees as well as City Council presentations, including supporting roles to the Land Development Code Updates.

Ali in his current role as Assistant Deputy Director supervises the structural review group of 40 professional engineers and supervises staff engineers that perform reviews for code modifications and alternate methods and materials.

As Research Engineer, Ali also reviewed hundreds of applications for code deviations from adopted building standards including Code Modifications and Applications for the Use of Alternate Methods and Materials and serves as the Secretary to the Board of Building Appeals and Advisors.

Ali successfully led the Department's effort to for the City of San Diego to be Classified by the Insurance Service Office, and the #2 ranking will have the potential to allow insurance rate reductions for our community due to the qualifications and effectiveness of the Division of Building Construction Safety (DBCS). He has also been integral part of DBCS continuing training efforts for staff including the triennial code update cycle.

In his spare time, Ali enjoys traveling, walking, and enjoying our great beaches and taking out his surfboards. He also spends time with family and friends.

### “Updates to the San Diego Municipal Code requirements for Geotechnical Reports – Outreach”

On a triennial basis, the City of San Diego adopts the latest editions of the California Fire, Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical, Residential, Green Building Standards Code and the Existing Building Code. The California Wildland Urban Interface Code was recently published and will be adopted by the Fire Rescue Department.

This is done in coordination with the State of California's adoption of these codes. This procedure provides an additional opportunity to modify local regulations and maintain local and statewide consistency. The proposed local amendments were developed by staff from the Development Services Department (DSD) after a thorough review of the State mandated codes, as well as the model codes that were used as the basis for development of the State code.

The purpose of the presentation is outreach to stakeholders that will be impacted due to proposed revisions to the local amendments to Chapter 18 of the California Building Code. More specifically exceptions to requirements that a geotechnical investigation be


undertaken, which will be included in a geotechnical investigation report, will be realigned with current development trends and recent updates to State laws.

New exceptions for new projects, projects proposing a change of occupancy, projects proposing additions and projects proposing certain alterations will include modified exceptions based on the following reasons.

1. The exceptions are informed by requirements implemented by the City of Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety in a similar major jurisdiction with similar hazards.
2. Recent updates to the Alquist-Priolo Earthquake Fault Zoning Act include new project valuation exceptions.
3. The regulations were last revised since initial adoption as local amendments to the 1982 UBC.

DSD's goal is to obtain input and support for the proposed code changes which will be included in a Report to City Council during continued processing culminating with City Council approval in late February.



# SAVE THE DATE

## PACIFIC SECTION SEPM FIELD TRIP

Join the Pacific Section SEPM for their field trip on

**MARCH 28-29, 2026**

Trip leader is Pat Abbott with co-leaders including Ron Kies and Bill Bartling. This trip touches all the bases – world class geologic sites along famous beaches

Examine all phases of a SUBMARINE FAN in beach cliff exposures of Upper Cretaceous (Campanian) strata in La Jolla and Pacific Beach, California. We will “wade through” Cretaceous 1) tidal channel deposits, 2) see dramatic deepening from 1m to 1km deep water, then take close-up looks at 3) basin plain, 4) outer submarine fan, 5) mid-fan. Added bonus of Eocene and Pliocene deposits at Tourmaline Beach.

**Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup>**




Walk below 100m high cliffs along Torrey Pines Beach in La Jolla. Examine Eocene lagoonal and tidal flat deposits that are cut by the north wall of an Eocene SUBMARINE CANYON. Continue walking south and see the lateral coarsening of sediment infill as a prograding alluvial fan delivered ever-coarser sediments into a widening submarine canyon. Added bonus of Paleocene/Eocene Thermal Maximum strata.
